College Credit for Attending ICAIA Conferences

ICAIA has consistently provided the automotive educators of the State of Illinois with the latest in automotive technology, education and training. Now in addition to offering attendees NATEF training documentation and CPDU credits for high school instructors, ICAIA is glad to announce that conference attendees can now also earn graduate level college credit through Southern Illinois University Carbondale (SIUC).

Mike Behrmann from SIUC will be at the Conference Registration Table on Thursday morning to explain all of the details to those interested. One credit hour of graduate level University credit can be obtained by attending the entire 2-day ICAIA Conference. Some of the specific details regarding the program include:

- 1. Since this is Graduate level credit, the conference attendee must have earned a Baccalaureate Degree prior to registration. If the conference attendee has never enrolled for graduate study at SIUC before, they can enroll only for one semester as a temporary nondeclared graduate student. After that, the conference attendee will need to be admitted to the Graduate School at SIUC as a regular nondeclared study student or admitted to a master's program.
- 2. The conference attendee must attend and participate in training sessions during both days of the ICAIA Conference.
- 3. The conference attendee must comply with all the necessary registration, documentation, reporting and payment requirements.

Troy Trapanier is one of the world's most renowned Hot Rod fabricators. Troy has a gift for restoring Hot Rods to a new level of magnificence that some people do not even have the ability to dream about. His father and grandfather nurtured the skills he needed to rebuild and fabricate Hot Rods to a new art form.

His first step began with a '66 Chevelle that his grandfather gave him as a gift. Once Troy saw what other people were doing at the DuQuoin Street Machine Nationals, it inspired him to "rebuild and repaint the '66 Chevelle in rasberry." "Gray Baskerville shot the car for Hot Rod magazine in late '86." This event changed his life forever. He continued to create Hot Rods that would become Hot Rod magazine's choice for Car of the Year and were included in the Top 10 List. Troy's last personal project was a '60 Rambler American wagon that was selected as "Hot Rod's Top 10 for 1994". After that, Troy was commissioned to do work for Dan Jacobs and "Rad Rods by Troy" was born.

"Rad Rods by Troy" now employees about 13 people. On the "Rad Rods by Troy" website are stories



of how Hot Rods are spiced up and reinvented. To his list of credits Troy Trepanier and "Rad Rods by Troy" recreated: a '60 Chevy Bel Air twodoor sedan, '50 Buick sedanette. '60 Rambler American wagon, '39 Chevy coupe, '54 Plymouth, the Sniper (a creation which combined a '97 Viper Coupe and '54 convertible), '57 Ford Ranch Wagon for Poteet, '61 Chevy Biscayne, '32 Ford roadster, '67 Lincoln convertible for the Red Sox' Manny Ramirez, and a '40 Ford convertible for Stan Fox. I am sure that this list is incomplete and does not do justice to his talent. With such exceptional craftsmanship, seeing is believing.
