

Mission and Purposes Illinois College Automotive Instructors Association



Paul Brian Keynote Speaker at the 62nd ICAIA Banquet

Veteran Chicago broadcaster Paul Brian and his Drive Chicago automotive radio show focuses on the local, national and international automotive scene, featuring industry news and newsmakers, product reviews and, of course, a flurry of questions from listeners wanting to get the straight story about the automotive industry. His show was recognized in 1998 and 1999 as the nation's best automotive program by the International Automotive Media Association.

"Who isn't involved at some level or other with cars?" asks Brian. "In the Chicago area alone, new car sales alone account for more than \$16.5 billion in gross sales. Obviously, there are countless questions

about the automotive field and we try to address them in an informative and entertaining manner. We'll talk about sales, leasing, safety, environment and the pure enjoyment of driving.

"Drive Time isn't a nuts and bolts technical workshop," Brian continued. "It's information the average listener can use and enjoy listening to, even if they're not in the market for a new vehicle."

For the past 13 years, Brian has served as communications director and spokesman for the Chicago Automobile Trade Association, producer of the mammoth annual Chicago Auto Show at McCormick Place. In that capacity, Brian is responsible for coordinating thousands of domestic and international media who arrive to view the nation's largest auto exposition. He is the recipient of two "Emmy" awards from the Academy of Television Arts and Science for production of television specials featuring the Chicago Auto Show.

Brian's background in the automotive industry dates back much further than he'd care to admit and includes a three-year stint of managing the Alfa Romeo Indy Car Team based in Milan, Italy, with drivers Danny Sullivan, Roberto Guerrero and Al Unser, Sr. He's been called the "John Madden of Indy Cars" (...but without the bus...) and has performed track announcing duties for the Milwaukee, Elkhart Lake, Houston, St. Louis and Chicago events on the CART Championship Circuit.

Paul is an accomplished chef and a marginal, yet enthusiastic golfer. He was also the winner of the 1983 World Championship Chili Cookoff in Terlingua, Texas.
