Butch Elzea, attended University of Missouri on a football scholarship and received a BS in business in 1969. With his father and grandfather their business has been established for over 85 years in the central Illinois area. Butch operates 10 Napa stores in the area. He was named President of his state association and named Man of the Year in 1989. He was honored in 2004 as the recipient of Springfield Small Business Chamber "Person of the Year" Award for business exceeding \$1 Million in sales.

Butch has headed the Friend in Deed Charity Golf Outing for the last 10-12 years raising more than \$1.2 million for the poor. He serves on several charitable boards including the Sangamon County Charitable Foundation. Cool Seminars Scheduled at Conference

A motorsports secret will be divulged at the 2007 Illinois College Automobile Instructors Association Fall Conference in Springfield. Attendees will learn at two seminars, how computer-controlled Cryogenic Treatment normally improves engine horsepower by 2-6% and reduces wear and breakage in engines, transmissions, rear ends, turbochargers, and superchargers. They will also learn how brake rotors can be Cryogenically-Treated to reduce brake rotor wear, help prevent warping and cracking, and normally increase brake rotor life by 250-400%. If that weren't enough, they will find that by Cryogenically Treating brake rotors, but not brake pads, pad life also increases. In other words, brake pad life increases because of the change made to the rotors.

Both seminars will be conducted by Bob Reed, Motorsports Division Manager, and Mining/Construction Specialist at 300 Below, Inc. in Decatur, Illinois. 300 Below, Inc. has roots dating back to the mid-60's and has appeared on the Discovery Channel. Bob, a former Industrial Arts teacher, has been with the company since 1994, and will also touch upon other applications, including the treatment of gears, shafts, bearings, and cases, as well as treatment of cutting tools, hydraulic pumps, slurry pumps, water pumps, compressors, musical instruments, golf clubs, and aluminum softball bats.

Reading the data:

For example, in Illinois:

- The 964 new vehicle dealerships make up only 3% of the total retail establishments in the state, but generate over 20% of the retail sales dollars in the state.
- The 964 new vehicle dealerships in the state employ about 7.7% of all retail employees in the state, but their payroll is 12.6% of the total retail payroll in the state.
- The average new vehicle dealership in the state has 49 employees and an annual payroll of \$2.32 million.

Using the data obtained from the National Automobile Dealers Association on the number of vehicles in operation and the employment data from the U.S. Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics, we may be able to make the following assumptions:

• In the state of Illinois, 5,704,638 passenger cars in operation are most likely serviced by a total of 7,600 automotive body and related repairers and 29,580 automotive service technicians and mechanics. In addition, the 3,753,614 total trucks and busses in operation are most likely serviced by a total of 10,370 bus and truck mechanics and diesel engine specialists.

That correlates to approximately 1 automotive body repairer to every 751 passenger cars, 1 automotive technician to every 193 passenger cars, and 1 bus and truck technician to every 362 trucks and buses.
