Fast Facts on the Automotive Industry

In December 2008, the Detroit Free Press put together an interactive map that displays the number of auto jobs across the country. The website for the map is: www.freep.com/article/20081202/business01/81126099

The Detroit Free Press reported the following for the State of Illinois:

Automotive Assembly Jobs	7,227	8%
Automotive Parts	27,113	29%
Auto Wholesale	5,160	6%
Parts Wholesale	8,823	9%
New Car Dealerships	45,440	48%
Total Automotive Jobs in Illinois	93,763	100%



These numbers placed Illinois as number seven amongst the states for total automotive jobs. For all States, they reported that the automotive industry directly employs more than 2 million workers in the United States who engineer, build, distribute and sell both foreign and domestic cars and trucks.

Editors Note: This study did not report on the scope and breathe of the automotive aftermarket industry. Thus, the true total of automotive jobs is significantly higher.

The Automotive Aftermarket Industry Association (AAIA) states that the motor vehicle aftermarket industry encompasses all products and services purchased for light and heavy duty vehicles after the original sale including replacement parts, accessories, lubricants, appearance products, service repairs, and the tools and equipment necessary to make the repair. AAIA reports that this sector employs approximately 4.5 million people in the U.S. and reported over \$285 billion in sales for 2007. www.aftermarket.org

In January 2008, the Automotive Trade Policy Council compiled a report titled "America's Auto Industry: Economic Contributions and Competitive Challenges". Their report included the following:

- Motor vehicles and auto parts are the single largest export sector for United States.
- The automotive industry is one of the single largest contributors to U.S. technological innovation by spending over \$16 billion annually in research and development. This is more than the aerospace, medical equipment, and communications industries.
- General Motors, Chrysler, and Ford directly employ over 320,000 Americans. Indirectly, they support over 6.1 million other jobs in the U.S. These include dealer and suppler employees and jobs affected by their spending.
